The following regulations shall guide the University of Embu Alumni Association members in conducting the 2021 Election scheduled for **Thursday 16th September 2021**.

1. All members of the Association (ordinary, associate, and honorary) are eligible to vote during the Alumni Election, 2021.
2. All voters shall fill the “**University of Embu Alumni Voter’s Data Collection Form**” provided on the Alumni website before **Tuesday 14th September 2021**.
3. Only ordinary members of the Association shall be eligible for election to any of the vacant office positions.
4. All interested candidates eligible for Election to any of the vacant office positions shall fill the **nomination form**, which must contain the candidate's name, signature, year of graduation, the position of interest, name, and signature of a proposer and a seconder who must be current ordinary members of the Association.
5. The nomination form shall be provided on the University of Embu Alumni website (alumni.embuni.ac.ke).
6. The form shall be downloaded from the website, printed, filled by hand, scanned, and sent to alumni@embuni.ac.ke on or before **Tuesday 14th September 2021**.
7. The duly filled nomination form shall be accompanied by a **clear** scanned official passport photo sent to the same email.
8. The Election shall be conducted electronically, where members eligible to vote shall be provided with a link to cast votes.
9. All members eligible to vote shall be allowed to vote only once, and repetitive voting shall be interpreted as void, and the votes termed spoilt.
10. The candidates with the majority number of votes shall be declared as winners of the respective vacant positions.
11. The duly elected candidates shall serve in office for two consecutive years, after which another general election will be held.
12. If a vacant office position receives one contestant, then the candidate will be considered elected in office.
